

Beyond 2015 Values and Targets for the post-2015 framework

Background

Since 2012, part of the focus of Beyond 2015 has been the conceptual foundations of the post-2015 agenda: the vision; the purpose and the values behind any framework, as well as criteria by which we can judge potential goals, targets and indicators. The bottom up approach

Most recently, Beyond 2015 has focused on potential targets which would ensure the framework expresses the values that we think should be at its foundations. By focusing on targets rather than goals we aim to avoid the siloed approach of the MDGs, and to make more holistic suggestions. Many of these targets therefore relate to more than one of the values. We have tried to indicate this in the table below.

Task Forces consisting of CSOs from all over the world have worked together to develop targets for each of foundational value area. These are:

1. **Environmental Sustainability**
2. **Human Rights**
3. **Poverty Eradication**
4. **Well-being**
5. **Peace and security**
6. **Equity**
7. **Global Responsibility**

Representatives of these Task Forces met in Pretoria on 21-22 March, along with Regional Coordinators, national lead agencies, key project partners (IFP, CAN International and Participate) and members of the Executive Committee to discuss, refine and ensure comprehensiveness and interlinkages between these targets.

Moving forward
